- Trails are open year-round, 7 days a week, from dawn until dusk.
- Our innovative Samuel P. Pardoe Buildings is open Monday-Saturday, 9am - 4pm, with displays, info and restrooms for visitors. Visit our shop to purchase Prescott Farm and other program-related merchandise!
- NO dogs are allowed - we are a designated wildlife viewing area and the scent of dogs disturbs the native wildlife.
- Keep to marked trails and do not collect or disturb plants or animals. Only foot travel is permitted—no horses, bicycles, or motor vehicles.
- Please respect private property which includes the Farmhouse and caretaker's house. Please carry out all trash and litter - leave no trace.
- NO smoking, hunting, trapping, firearms, camping or fires.
- Please dress appropriately for weather and terrain, including good walking/hiking shoes.
